Background & Objective

On 14th of December 2018 a new set of rules on the taking of evidence in arbitration will be released: the Rules on the Efficient Conduct of Proceedings in International Arbitration, also known as the "Prague Rules".

Prior their official release, the "Prague Rules" have already attracted considerable attention. Some view them to be the civil law response to the IBA Rules on the Taking of Evidence in International Arbitration. Other commentators see these rules as contributing to increasing efficiency in international arbitration.

Get a head start on the Prague Rules with ICC Austria: the event will provide an analysis of their content, followed by a Q&A session debating in which settings they will be most useful.
